On April 24th, NYU and Stanford Departments of Radiology organized the BOLD AIR Summit. Co-directed by Dr. Yvonne Lui and Dr. David Larson, this was a *FREE* one day summit bringing together bioethicists, legal experts and imaging experts to address a range of topics from ethical principles and privacy considerations to regulatory issues when it comes to Artificial Intelligence in radiology. Two white papers currently under works-in-progress from the ACR and Stanford were also presented and discussed.

NYU Resident and Faculty Recognition

2018 RSNA Annual Oration in Diagnostic Radiology Dr. Michael P Recht

Dr. Recht had the honor of giving the Annual Oration in Diagnostic Radiology at the RSNA 2018 meeting. He discussed how radiologists and radiology departments can utilize recent advances in informatics, analytics/business intelligence and AI/machine learning to become more integrated into the clinical care team and more visible and “user-friendly” to referring physicians and patients. He shared NYU Radiology’s informatics innovations including virtual rounds and virtual consults, enhanced (multimedia) imaging reports, “collaborative” imaging pathways, radiology-pathology feedback loops and a newly developed patient-centric radiology mobile app.

During his address, Dr. Recht also announced the release of more than 1.5 million anonymous MR images from our fastMRI collaboration with Facebook AI Research (FAIR), a partnership focused on using AI to speed up MRIs. This is the largest-ever open source dataset released. The aim of NYU Radiology’s collaboration with Facebook on this project is to foster the development of AI technology to make MRI scans 10X faster.

Allie is a Houston native living in Harlem with her fiancé and their dog, Blue. She enjoys dance and ice skating and is planning a career as a breast radiologist.



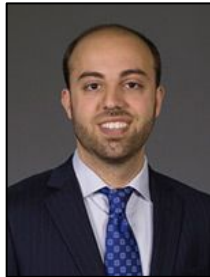
Chenyang Zhan (2nd year resident)

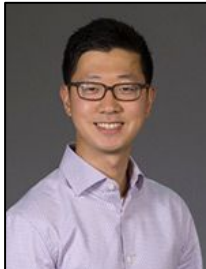

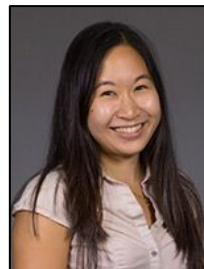
